



Nordkoster, part of the beautiful Koster Islands, offers coastal hiking in a dramatic landscape and across heathlands and through small forests. At one of the beaches, you can enjoy a truly salty swim. The most recent Ice Age has left impressive marks, such as the cobblestone fields at Valnäs bay, which are definitely worth seeing. Valnäs is also home to the rare buttercup known as the Bohusranunkel.

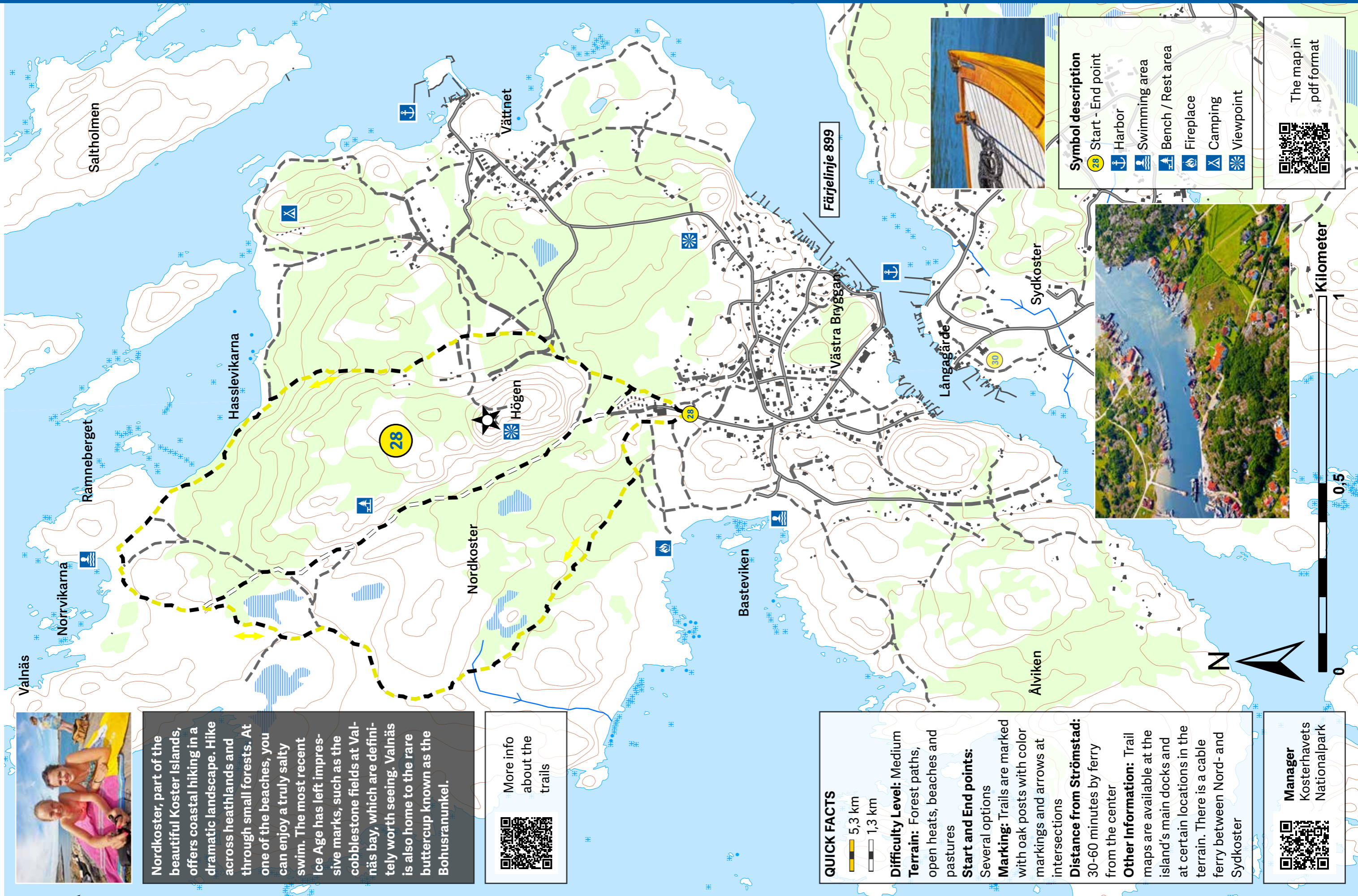
**Distance from Strömstad:**
