

On Nord Långö in the Strömstad archipelago lies Alaska, a site established in the late 1920s by 60-year-old Hilma Svedahl (1870-1965). She had returned to her hometown after about 30 years in America, where she had lived an adventurous life, including gold mining in Alaska. A visit to the island for a coffee break and a walk around the area, which is now a nature reserve, is a popular summer activity. Be sure to bring swimwear, as there are excellent opportunities for swimming.
